

Pupil Premium 2018–2019

Academic year 2018–2019

Allocation: £13,300 (7 children)

Main barriers to educational achievement:

- Poor attendance
- Poor diet which leads to ‘slumps’ during the day and poor attention
- Lack of opportunities to practice reading, writing and Maths skills
- Emotional issues, which leads to negative attitudes to learning
- Significant SEND needs

How to spend Pupil Premium to overcome barriers:

- Targeted intervention groups for children to work on basic skills x3 times per week, as well as TA support within class.
- Intervention group once per week based on developing growth mindset and building resilience.
- Funding breakfast club place to ensure child is brought into school on time every day and provided with a nutritious breakfast
- Funding after school club sessions to ensure that the children get opportunities to take part in physical activity.

How to measure the effect:

- Children making good progress from their starting point
- Attendance above 90%
- Good attitudes to learning
- Improved food choices in their lunchboxes
